

SUMMER RED MAPLE

ACER rubrum 'HOSR' Summer Red Maple



- Height: 30-45'
Spread: 25-30'
Shape: symmetrical canopy with a regular (or smooth) outline, and individuals have more or less identical crown forms. Crown shape: oval; round
- Foliage: Deciduous. Opposite/subopposite, simple, lobed; incised; serrate, ovate palmate deciduous 2 to 4 inches green and showy
- Fall Color: Predominately yellow fall color (variable)
- Hardiness: 4-9a
- Comments: **Premium Shade Tree. New leaves emerge as purple to red.** Mature leaves are dark green bearing a striking contrast against the new growth. Yellow fall color. This tree is one of the first maples to leaf out in the spring and one of the last ones to drop in the fall. The summer foliage is the most outstanding characteristic of this tree. New leaves are lustrous red to purple, changing to dark green as they mature. This superb season-long coloration is a fantastic trade-off for the absence of fall color.
- Light Requirements: Light requirement: tree grows in part shade/part sun; tree grows in full sun or dappled shade
- Soil Tolerances: Soil tolerances: clay; loam; sand; acidic; extended flooding; well-drained
- NOTES: Use as a residential street tree. Ideal for smaller lawn space. Well suited to North Texas.
